1. At the end of October 1946 units of the Polish Army were located as follows:

47th Infantry Regiment	Lomza (F79) in the province of Bialystok.
49th Infantry Regiment	Biala Podlaska (M46) west of Brest-Litovsk (M87).
57th Infantry Regiment	Suwalki (B29) near the East Prussia-Lithuania frontier.
65th Infantry Regiment	Bialystok

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2. At the end of October 1946 a military train for direction-finding work, equipped with radio and consisting of seven cars, was at the station of Lapy (between Warsaw and Drest Litovsk); it changed its position frequently, moving up and down the Warsaw - Bialystok - Grodno (DS5) line. The [redacted] train [redacted] is under the command of a Soviet major in Polish uniform [redacted]. It serves the entire district.

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
