SUPPLEMENT

- 1. Each Army has one or several disciplinary battalions composed of the Commanding Officer, the Political Commisser and staff, and three companies of approximately 100 soudier prisoners. These units include deserters, political suspects, sabo tours, and other political delinquests.
- 2. Seldiers incorporated in these battalions are used for physical work. Food, clothing, and shows are in a worse condition than in any other unit in the Tugeslav Army. Political commissars are making use of all methods to reeducate the prisoners. Starvation, thirst, flogging, and incarceration are, as in civilian concentration camps, the main punishment. The prisoners remain from six to twelve months with these units and are then reincorporated in their original units, provided their political chief. have realized that they have changed. If not, their resducation is continued.
- 3. During the war, the first disciplinary battalions were sacrificed and placed on the most dangerous and difficult positions, for instance, along the Srem battle
- 4. The disciplinary battalion for the First Army is located in Mladenovac. The disciplinary battalion for the Third Army is located in Petrovaradia, and resembles the worst Mazi concentration camps god its managed and hand
