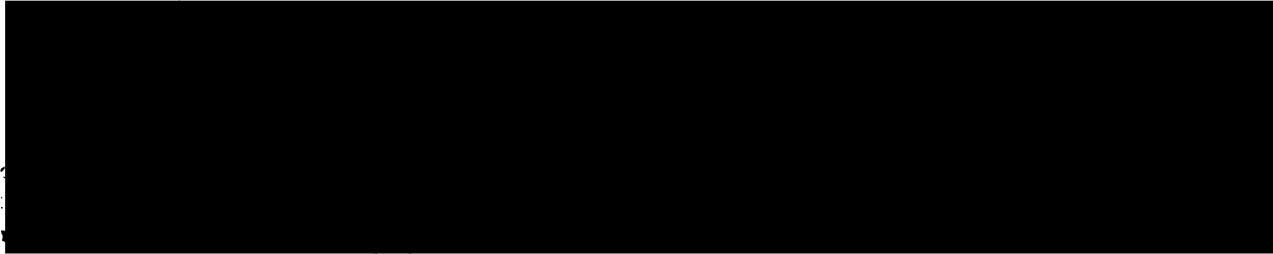

25X1X 1. Curfew is enforced in Hailar (119-44, 49-13) and Manchouli (117-27, 49-36) during the night, even though bandits and thieves are few. In Tsitsihar (123-57, 47-22) a curfew is enforced from 2000 hours to 0600 hours, with which civilians as well as military must comply.

2. No travel permits whatsoever are needed from Chalantun (122-45, 48-01) to Manchouli, and traveling is simple and convenient. Northward from Chalantun, however, travelers are required to carry permits issued by the Chinese Communist Public Safety Bureau.

3. Chinese are permitted to travel freely as far as 50 li west of Manchouli without travel permits or fear of being searched. Beyond this area, where Soviet patrols and railway inspection stations are encountered, Chinese are not allowed to travel unless they carry special Chinese Communist travel permits.
