

- 1. It is reported that the Central Committee of the Chilcan Comminist Monty will soon withdraw its financial support from the newspaper <u>Extra</u>, and the the editors, Juan de Luigi and Alejandro Flores, will have to discontint, publication of the paper or else find hew capital. De Luigi has requested additional time to make other arrangements.
- 2. In the meantime it appears that de Luigi and Flores are negotiating ith the Radical Party Senator, Rudecindo Ortega, and the Radical Party indus fields, Luis Mozo, to buy the paper for 250,000 pesos, with de Luigi and FL 3 continuing as directors. Since the paper has no presses of its own and is printed by the Communist paper, El Siglo, the purchasers would, in effect, it buying only the name and good will of Extra. This latter deal has not yet then completed, although it appears likely that it will go through.
- 3. Although Extra has been just about breaking even financially, with the aid of the Communist Party, and has obtained a fair circulation, the reason liven by the Central Committee for discontinuing its support is in order that it may concentrate more time, money, and effort on <u>El Siglo</u>. It is also in located that the Communist Party does not believe that de Luigi can find other backers and that, therefore, the presses can be more advantageously utilized in the printing of Communist Leaflets, books, and other propaganda.
