1. The Soviet Embassy in Buenos Aires has ordered all Soviet, Ukrainian, and Byelorussian citizens who have Soviet passports to withdraw from the Argentine Communist Party.

2. [REDACTED] the Embassy issued these instructions to the various pro-Communist Ukrainian and Byelorussian societies shortly after the expulsion from Chile of the two Yugoslav suspect agents and the subsequent repressive measures taken against the Communists by the Government of that country. The Russian diplomat stated that, in the event the Argentine government attempts to curb the activities of the Communists in Argentina, persons who did not comply with the order could expect no protection from the Soviet Embassy.
3. It was recommended, however, that all individuals with Soviet passports continue to cooperate with the local Slav communities.
