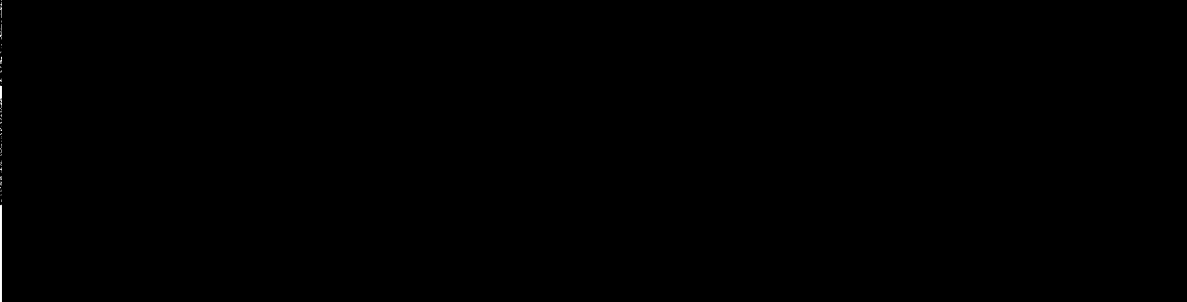

The following document is a copy of a paper seized by the Bombay Police during their raids of Communist Party Headquarters during March and April 1948. This document presents information pertaining to the Marx School of the Australian Communist Party and gives a schedule of the evening classes for the fourth term (October - December 1946), a list of the required reading material, and names of the instructors. This school was located at Sydney, Australia. No attempt has been made to edit this document.

Australian Communist Party - Marx School
For The Study Of Marxism - Leninism.

Marx School was established by the Central Committee in October 1942, to provide facilities for an advanced study of scientific socialism. The Australian Communist Party has achieved its present proud position in Australian life, and will continue to advance, because of its firm adherence to the principles of Marxism-Leninism.

Membership is open to all A.C.P. members; the fee is 2/6 a quarter, 10/- a year. This entitles members to free enrollment for any of the courses, free admittance to Sunday night lectures, and free use of the Marx School reference library.

The enrollment form is on page 6 of this folder; it should be filled in and forwarded to Marx School, 695 George Street, Sydney.

Standard Required

The Party branches have the responsibility of organizing classes on Study Courses 1, 2, and 3, in order to provide members with a working knowledge of the main points of Marxism. Then comrades can proceed to Marx School for more advanced study. With
