1. Despite the firmness with which the Syrian Government attempted to suppress Communism in Syria, there is evidence that the movement continues to be strong in Damascus, where Communists are still holding neetings and making a certain amount of progress. The Executive Committee of the Communist Party, as of 5 January 1949, was holding weekly and semi-weekly neetings in the home of Qadri Hakin, a member of the Party and a teacher in the Hational College for Girls. The Syrian Deuxiene Bureau discovered that at one of those neetings most of the Communists present were in the employ of the Syrian Government. Among those present were Hunir Sulayman,* Chiof of the Damascus Provincial Office; Khalid Ali, an instructor in the Tajhiz (secondary) school in Damascus; and Antun Kardush;**a Palestinian refugee who is in charge of the Signal Section of the Syrian Army.

lains that the Deuxieme Bureau also has evidence that, not only are the local Danascene Communists in touch with representatives of the Soviet Union, but national figures are also in contact with the Soviets, Ahmad Sharebati, former Syrian Defense Hinister, was, until his resignation from office, a protector of the Syrian Communist Party leader, Khalid Baghdash, and gave him refuge in a building which Sharabati owns. Sharabati also became acquainted with Soviet Hinister Solod, through the former's business partner, Arif Totah. This acquaintance was at first purely social, but later developed into a mutually beneficial alliance of selfish interests, source states. Sharabati and Solod, or Solod's representative, meet in an office above the Hollywood Cinema, Place des Canons, Beirut, which had been rented by Totah, supposedly as an office for one of his business enterprises; but which is never used as an office, and is kept guarded at all times, source states.

Comment. Sulsyman was described in Harch 1946 as a provincent nember of the Communist Party who was advocating closer liaison between the Syrian Communist Party and the Soviet Union. In September 1947 Sulayman was said to be a brother of Shafiq Sulayman (one of Quavatli's most trusted lieutenants) and an intimate friend of Ahmad Sharabati. Sulayman's son-in-law is Thean Bey Sharif, Syrian Hinister to Turkey.
