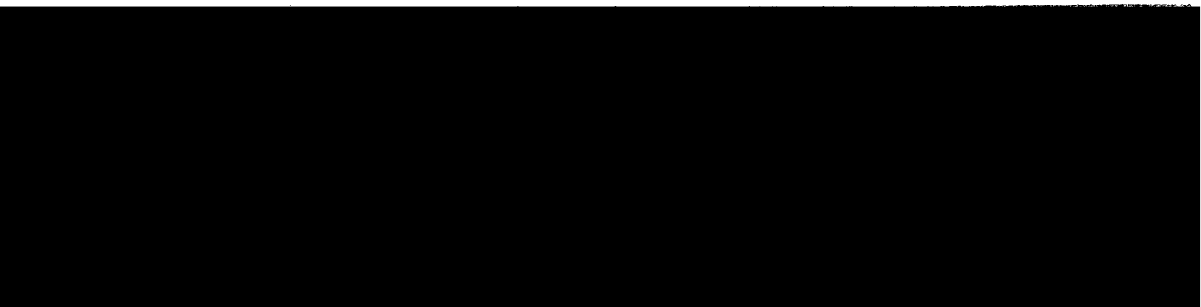

1. Despite denials by the Peruvian government, a usually reliable source states that the Bolivian government has definite proof of its official accusations that in December 1943 Peruvian Minister of Public Works Alfonso Llosa visited the Peruvian army station at Huancane in the company of Edmundo Nogales, Movimiento Nacionalista Revolucionario (MNR) exile in Peru.* 25X1X6
2. Source states that it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Bolivian government that Llosa and Nogales had made the trip as described in the official Bolivian memorandum of protest to the Peruvian government.

Comment. On 18 April the Peruvian Ambassador in La Paz handed to the Foreign Minister a memorandum, dated 14 April, which denied that Llosa had visited the Departments of Arequipa, Puno, or Cuzco since becoming a member of the Junta government. It also denied that either Llosa or Nogales had visited the army station at Huancane, as charged by Bolivia.
