- The Communists are spreading the rumor that the Nationalists mined the mouth
 of the Yangtze River at Woosung.
- 2. This rumor is being spread in order to gain time to settle a dispute between Communist military and political factions over opening Shanghai trade to foreign commerce.
- 3. Communist political leaders feel that General CHEN Yi, Communist mayor of Shanghai, is attempting to reopen Shanghai to foreign trade too soon.
- 4. Nationalist General FU Tso-yi* is still alive. Most of his troops are disarmed and divided into small ineffective units.
- 5. Between 10 April and 10 June 1949, approximately 130,000 Chinese and foreigners left Canton**.
