The report is of special interest as it has long been expected that, in view of the extensive reconditioning and expanding of some Baltic Sea ports of the Soviet Zone of Germany, the Soviets would start shipping supplies by sea.	
	b. It is considered possible that, as stated in the report, the ammunition was shipped from RCJTOCK to JURTERBOG-ALTES LAGRA and JESSEN.
