SOURCE

The following observations were made in GYOR (P 48/X 44):

1. Rifle (Vadasz) Barracks:

Occupied by a guard detail of about 30 men wearing red-bordered black epaulets with artillery insignia. The trucks observed in the barracks area were still blocked up as was observed before. The stocks of fire wood had been increased.

The truck [redacted] was repeatedly seen in the barracks area and in the town.

2. Artillery Barracks, GYOR-SZABADHEGY:

No activity was observed in the barracks. One soldier wearing red-bordered black epaulets was seen.

3. Frigyes Barracks:

Intensive construction work was done on all barracks buildings, presumably for Hungarian purposes.

4. Several neglected houses at 10 Cruzag Street:

Some sick Soviet soldiers with red-bordered black epaulets. Four or five trucks and some horse-drawn vehicles were also seen there.

5. No changes were observed with the HQ of the Hungarian 5th Border Guard Bn on Apaca Street.

Comment:

The report indicates that the situation in GYOR in early September 1949 was as previously observed (rear details; blocked-up motor vehicles). The reported motor vehicle number belongs to the 17th Jds Mecz Div.
