Comment:

a. The occupation of the airfield has not been clarified. It has been assumed that the fighter rejiment previously stationed there, was transferred to Parkingularly together with the DOUBLASTE fighter units. The transferred STAMEN unit was replaced by ground attack units from DOUBLASTE. Lixty to eighty ground attack aircraft were allegedly purked at the field on 17 September 1949. The DOUBLASTED unit equipped with twin-engine aircraft was also allegedly transferred to STAMER.

b. According to this report, the fighter registent was apparently still etationed at the field 23 teptember 1949, but no ground attack aircraft were observed. The ground attack bircraft seen at the field 17 deptember 1949, were possibly only temporarily stationed there for training. It seems to be proved that the twin-engine aircraft from conductable are now stationed in criakin. These aircraft are assumed to be assigned to a component training regiment of the III har Jorps.

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
