25X1 1. In the first days of September 1949, more than 4,000 men, women, and children, escorted by armed MVD guards, were in transit through the Brest-Litovsk station. In Brest, they were made to alight from the trains and were subjected to a thorough search. Then they were made to ascend into freight cars, and the men were separated from the women and children. Their baggage was sorted, examined carefully, and burned.

25X1 2. [Redacted] these persons were Poles from formerly Polish territory acquired by the USSR after the war, and that they were being moved elsewhere in the Soviet Union.
