- 25X1 1. LIN Ch'iang-yun\* has been appointed Director of the Bureau of Labor in the Chinese Communist government of Kwangtung Province. During the war, LIN was head of the Pearl River Column. During the general strike in Hong Kong in 1926 he was an agent provocateur for the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). LIN is said to have visited Moscow in 1949.
- 2. In January 1950, WONG Kwong-wah\*\*, paid secretary of the Rubber Workers' Union, Shaukiwan Branch, Hong Kong, was ordered by the CCP to Canton for reassignment. In early February 1950 his successor had not yet been named.
