REPORT NO. 25X1X Jahonju (CHI Chen-fu)*, member of the Longolian-Tibetan Affairs Commission and chief of the Department of Mongolian Affairs, and Sochongga**, chief of the Political Affairs Department and Josoto League delegate to the National Assembly, together with more than ten fellow-kongols and forty Kongol students who had remained in Nanking, were taken to Peiping by the Chinese Communists. They were questioned individually in Peiping and then sent on to Wangyehmiac. The Peiping office of the Wangyehmiac government, which occupies the premises formerly used by the Mongolian-Tibetan Affairs Commission, is headed by Kac-ko-erh-cha-pu***, formerly of Tumet Special (Kueihua Tumet) Banner. YANG Ping, formerly a special agent for the Police Bureau of Changchiak ou, Chahar Province, is deputy chief of the office. 3. The Peiping office of the Wangyehmiao government was to handle all Mongolian problems ** ** *, without interference from the North China government. More than three hundred students from the Mongolian-Tibetan School in Peiping were sent to the Wangyehmiao military and Political University for training. The Wangyehmiao regime has ten cavalry divisions and a total of approximately one hundred thousand soldiers. During August 1949, the Wangyehmiao government sent some two hundred persons by train from Peiping to Poingtich' uan *** ** from where they infiltrated into Mongolia to work against Prince Te's autonomous Mongolian regime. Although the Chinese Communists and TUNG Ch'i-wu agreed that TUNG would control Suiyuan for two years, the Chinese Communists sent their own officials to the Province.
