The following military units and installations were noted in Krakow:

1. One infantry division.
2. One artillery regiment and other regiments such as an anti-aircraft gun (Flak) regiment and an anti-tank gun (Pak) regiment. Total strength was about 15,000.
3. One artillery regiment, stationed at Czerwony Prodnik, a district in the northeastern part of the city. The regiment consists of four divisions for every four batteries. Each battery has three guns---122 mm. short howitzer and 102 mm. field artillery. These guns are transported by means of caterpillar tractors. Between the suburbs (Czerwony Prodnik) and Krakow stands an old fortress which was built during Austrian rule; it is not used for military purposes, but contains a political prison of the UB.
4. A large barracks on Rakowiecka. They extend over four or five large blocks, are 25 x 80 m. in size, and have three or four stories. The buildings are of red brick. Infantry troops are quartered in these barracks.
5. DOW (Dowodstwo Okregu Wojskowego-Krakow) is located in the Hotel Royal on Gert-ruda Street, opposite the "Wawel". Chief of DOW is General Mosor, who is 52 years old, 1.75 m. tall, and has dark-blond hair. Liaison officer is a Russian colonel in Polish uniform; he is about 50 years of age, 1.72 m. tall, and bald. He lives with his Russian wife in a new, gray, four-story house situated on the corner of Szpitalna and Thomasza Streets.
6. Flak stations in Krakow-Podgorze. Not far from the Vistula River are the mounds of Kopiec Krakusa and Kopiec Wandy, on which 82 - 122 mm. Flak guns have been installed.
7. Flak stations in Las Wolski, a woods on the left side of the road in the direction of Katowice. Flak stations are also found on the mound known as Kopiec Kosciuszki, which is near the Viscula, and on the Kopiec Pilsudskiego mound.


