1. It is reported that the Executive Commission of the Partido Socialista de Nicaragua (PSN) has been engaged in setting up a clandestine radio station. The preparations are being carefully guarded, but source was able to learn that those involved in the technical work are Nicolas Sandino, and the two


2. The station, known as "La Voz de la Libertad," often goes on the air at eight-thirty in the evening, Managua-time, on 7.3 megacycles. The frequency is reportedly low. The Executive Commission and PSN leaders have learned that the Guardia Civil is aware of the existence of the station, and that they have been trying to locate it. However, all concerned appear to be satisfied that the Guardia has been unsuccessful thus far.

sons of Edmundo Leets Castillo. Sandino, a radio technician, is an active member of the PSN. Leets, who is prominent in the PSN, works for the Empresa de Luz y Fuerza Electrica. His sons are radio enthusiasts.

Comment. The Guardia Civil at first believed that the unregistered station was broadcasting from within Nicaragus. At present the Guardia is inclined to believe that the broadcast comes from across the border in Honduras. In any case, they do not appear to associate the station with the PSN.
