- 1. On 9 July, the families of all South Korean soldiers and National Police remaining in Seoul were gathered by the Communists into warehouses near the Seoul railroad station so that they would be killed by U.S. bomb attacks. Members of the Communist Self-Confession Alliance beat South Korean soldiers in Seoul hospitals. On 8 July, there were 2700 wounded at the Seoul Red Cross hospital; the number of wounded in other hospitals was unknown.

- 4. On 5 July Soviet representatives in Seoul picked up an unknown number of volunteer girls' school students who were shipped to the USSR to work in war material factories.
