1. One hundred and ninety tank cars containing fuel passed through the Frankfurt/Oder marshalling yard en route from the U.S.S.R. to Veiten between 8 and 22 July 1950. Consignee was Unit [REDACTED] (1) 25X1A

2. Ammunition shipments passing through Frankfurt/Oder en route from the U.S.S.R. between 13 and 21 July 1950 included: 25X1X

3. A shipment of twenty tanks from Brest Litovsk to Muellrose arrived in Frankfurt/Oder on 14 July 1950. There the shipment was broken up and redispached, with four tanks going to Jena, four to Samenz, four to Eberswalde, three to Doberitz, three to Stendal and two to Neustrelitz. Unit [REDACTED] was consignee of all these shipments. (3) 25X1A

4. A shipment of 40 trucks was dispatched to Koenigswusterhausen on 21 July 1950. Consignee was Unit [REDACTED]. A shipment of 35 damaged trucks went to Wurzen on the same day. (4) 25X1A

5. A train of 14 boxcars occupied by soldiers with red-bordered black epaulets, and an unknown number of flatcars carrying eighteen 37-mm AT series was observed on the Fuerstenwalde-Frankfurt/Oder-Cottbus line on 10 July 1950. (5) 25X1C

6. Four 76.2-mm guns and six trucks, including four [REDACTED] were unloaded at the military ramp of the Frankfurt/Oder railroad station and driven to the Artillerie Kaserne on 10 July 1950. (6) 25X1C
