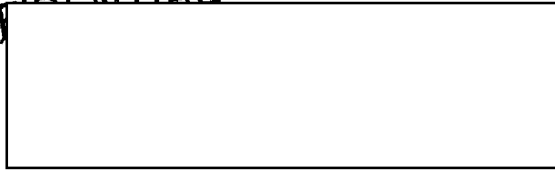
1. The aircraft crates which were previously observed at Trolenhagen (N 54/U 67) airfield, left there on 3 July 1950 via Neubrandenburg for Pasewalk (N 54/Q 16). At least eight crates were counted. Soldiers wearing black-bordered blue epaulets escorted the shipment. \*
  2. Twenty-one railroad flatcars, loaded with 20 large and three small crates, arrived at the Neubrandenburg - South railroad station at 9 p.m. on 15 July 1950. The escorting soldiers wore black-bordered red epaulets. The shipment was unloaded by a crane at the Trolenhagen airfield at 10 a.m. on 16 July 1950. [redacted] the dispatch station was Brest Litovsk. \* 25X1
  3. On 17 July 1950 a train with mounted cranes was pulled from Pasewalk to Wolgast (N 55/P 92) [redacted] and from Wolgast to Neubrandenburg on 18 July 1950 [redacted] 25X1
  4. Thirty-five crates from Neubrandenburg arrived in Pasewalk at 1:35 p.m. on 13 July 1950. They were shipped to Wolgast at 4:05 p.m.
  5. A train loaded with 35 crates left Anklam (N 54/U 99) at 5:25 p.m. on 17 July 1950 in the direction of Pasewalk. It was guarded by sentries wearing black-bordered blue epaulets. [redacted] the train left Wolgast at noon and that it had a label showing Brest Litovsk as receiving station. \*\* The train was seen in Pasewalk at 5 a.m. on 18 July 1950. [redacted] the crates contained aircraft sections. 25X1

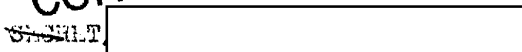
is believed that the crates previously observed contained jet aircraft for the airfields of Neubrandenburg and Peene-  
muende. See [redacted] The exact number of jet planes now  
stationed at these two airfields is not known.

\*\* [redacted] Comment. The crates which left in the direction of  
Brest Litovsk were either empty or used for the shipment  
of conventional fighters.
