

Emil Lovlien, Chairman of the Norweglan Communist Party, arrived at Kastrup Airport, Copenhagen, from Warsaw on 21 August 1950. He was met by Mieczyslaw Lakomy, Second Secretary of the Polish Legation in Copenhagen. Lowlien and Lakomy conferred for about an hour at Hammers Restaurant, then returned to the airport transit hall where they talked briefly with an unidentified Polish-speaking man. Lowlien then returned to his plane and continued his journey to Oslo. 2. Another passenger on the plane which brought Lovlien from Warsaw was Barbara Mikolajezyk, born in Warsaw on 20 March 1927, who was traveling with a child born in 1947. They were leaving by plane for New York on the evening of 21 August, and Mikolajczyk obtained permission to accompany Mieczyslaw Lakomy to the Polish Legation while waiting for her plane. No contact between Emil Lovlien and Barbara Mikolajczyk was observed.
