1. Twenty-two Pe-2s, 8 twin-engine aircraft with single rudder assemblies and 50 single engine fighters were at Wiener Neustadt (O 48/X 35) airfield on 3 August 1950. There was intensive flying, mostly by fighters.

2. Two fighters with dismantled wings and engines, and a Pe-2, also with the engine dismantled, were seen at the repair shop in Theresienfeld (O 48/X 35). Trucks C 6-72-14, C 6-72-17 and C 6-72-19 were parked there.

* Comment. The information on the occupation of the Wiener Neustadt airfield agrees with previous reports. [REDACTED] From the aircraft and motor vehicle numbers it is believed that the field is still occupied by a fighter regiment and a transport regiment equipped with Pe-2s and LI-2s. The occupation of the Nachrichtenkasernen on Pernersdorfer Strasse and the motor vehicle numbers observed there also agree with available information. However, this information loses value since all reports have been furnished by the same source.
