

- Early on the morning of 29 September there were 5,000 to 7,000 North Korean troops scattered in paddies on the sides of the mountains near Chechon (128-12, 37-08) to the Pyongchang (128-24, 37-22) highway, moving toward Pyongchang. The troops were accompanied by five tanks and 10 trucks loaded with wounded.
- The Volunteer Army and remnants of various (unidentified) units have been reorganized into the 17 Division of Kangwon Province. These troops are equipped with small arms.
- On 29 September there were 1,500 North Korean troops in Chechon. There were five mortars on the small hill southeast of the city,
