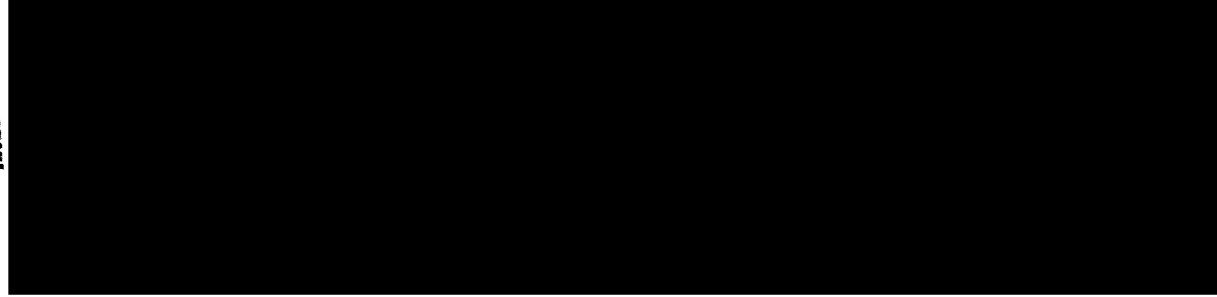

1. The Wa Chi,* a Chinese guerrilla organization which is composed of Chinese members of the wartime anti-Japanese Hukbalahap organization, has gone underground. Members have joined various front organizations, including several Chinese musical organizations and family tongs.
2. The Confucius Theater** is a meeting place for certain of these front musical organizations. Another known meeting place which is being watched by Philippine authorities is at 80 Soler Street, Manila.
3. The Chinese National Volunteers' Association, which may be the same organization as the National Volunteers of the Philippines,*** has admitted many former Wa Chi members. Cabo CHAN is the head of the Chinese National Volunteers' Association. CHAN and his son are believed to have participated in the kidnapping of a wealthy Philippine Chinese. No action has been taken against them by Philippine authorities.***
