Three parachutists jumped in rapid succession from a twin-engine aircraft, presumably a DC-3, over the Finow airfield at 4:30 p.m. on 6 October 1950. The jump was made from an altitude of about 2,000 meters and the parachutes opered after a fall of about 50 meters. Two more groups of 2 and 5 men ani an individual parachutist jumped after the aircraft had each flown one circle. (7) Therty-one jet planes with swept-back wings and a red cover on the air extanst, 27 single-ingine low-wing monoplanes and five DC-3s were counted at the Finow airfield from 3 to 5 p.m. on 7 October 1950. (2) The western housdary of the field was formed by the road to Diesenthal from kilometer marker 0.1 to about 1.6. An east-west runway, about 2 km long, begins about 150 m west of this road. Comments 25X1A presumably is assigned to an element of the Hq Twenty-Fourth Air 25X1B Army . (2) The data on the occupation of the field confirm the presence of type Hig-15 fighters, and conventional piston fighters. According to other information the field is occupied by two fighter regiments. These fighter regiments 25X1 and among the few fighter units which are apparently still equipped with a sizeable number of conventional fighter aircraft.
