REMARKS

1. On 2 November 1950, about 1,000 troops arrived in Rostock aboard a ship from Latvia. Some of the troops were last seen on a train on the Rostock-Doberan line. [redacted] was identified in connection with the debarkation. (1)
2. On 16 November a shipment of 20 boxes with tools was en route to Ketschendorf [redacted] (2)
3. The leave train which arrived in Frankfurt/Oder from East-Litovsk on 16 November was occupied to capacity by troops, including 120 officers. The officers were brought to a barracks installation in Frankfurt/Oder on four trucks. At 8 p.m. on the same day about 120 officers boarded the leave train heading toward Dresden-Erfurt. (3)
4. Since 16 November one sleeping car and two dining cars with the necessary personnel were standing at the Koepenick railroad station, ready for immediate departure. The cars were earmarked for use by high-ranking Soviet officers.
5. Military trains observed between 14 and 16 November included:

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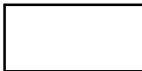


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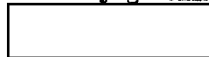
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Nineteen tank cars with military gasoline;

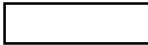


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Five boxcars with military goods;

Comments.

(1) [redacted] on the debarkation of troops in Rostock have never been given credence. The information is therefore forwarded with a certain reserve. However, a report that recruits were unloaded in Doberitz on 12 November 1950 stated that they allegedly came from the direction of Rostock.

[redacted] was frequently reported in connection with Camp Gronenfelde near Frankfurt/Oder where returning German PWs are processed for discharge.

(2) [redacted] confirms the 12th Mobile Arty Shop in Ketschendorf until 16 November 1950.

(3) Compare with similar observations made [redacted] during the first half of November.

(4) The two loaded shuttle-trains probably carried soldiers due for discharge.

[redacted] belongs to the office of the Chief of Supply and Administrative Services of the GOPG in Potsdam, with field offices in the entire Soviet Zone of Germany.

[redacted] was previously reported from Eberswalde and verified by documents.

[redacted] confirms the main fuel supply depot in Velten until 20 November.

[redacted] belongs to an element of the AAA Div of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army in Fuerstenwalde.

[redacted] belongs to a supply unit in Fuerstenberg.

[redacted] probably belongs to a supply unit in the Eberswalde area.

[redacted] confirms the 320th Ration Supply Depot in Frankfurt/Oder until 19 November

[redacted] confirms the 136th Gds Hvy Tank SP Regt of the Third Shock Army in Burg until 19 November.

[redacted] belongs to a supply unit in Jueterbog.

[redacted] confirm the 123d Tank Repair Shop in Muellrose and Kirchmoeser until 20 November.

[redacted] confirms the 248th Gds RL Tn of the 10th Gds Tank Div in Kramnitz until 19 November.

[redacted] presumably belongs to a repair shop in Eberswalde.

[redacted] confirms the main clothing depot in Bernau until 19 November.

[redacted] confirms the main medical depot in Fuerstenwalde until 20 November.

[redacted] confirms the Hq 7th Gds Mecz Div in Fuerstenwalde until 18 November.

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
