

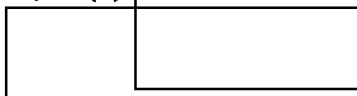

1. About 40 jet fighters with swept-back wings, 1 two-seater jet fighter, 3 single-engine, low-wing monoplanes with radial engines and red propeller hubs, and 5 biplanes were parked at the Laerz (N 54/U 33) airfield between 24 November and 2 December 1950. (1)

(2) There was no flying during the period of observation.

2. A train loaded with motor vehicles left Rechlin (N 54/U 33) on the evening of 28 November. the Soviet Air Force was to leave Rechlin to make room for a pilots school of the Volkspolizei. (3)
3. It was observed that the western end of the runway is in line with kilometerstones 32.5 to 32.7. (4)
