1. In addition to artillery ammunition for guns of Soviet origin, ammunition for machine guns, installed on JAK planes, is also produced in Vogosca, near Sarajevo. Furthermore, the ammunition for Soviet 84 mm. mortars, Breda aircraft guns and anti-aircraft guns of German origin is manufactured there. [Redacted] no other factory than that of Vogosca, produces Soviet-type ammunition. 50X1-HUM

2. The ammunition for arms of Soviet origin is stored in different depots. Before the Cominform split, the Russians sent ammunition to Yugoslavia, and it is now reported that machine gun ammunition of Soviet manufacture, mainly for aircraft, is stored in the depots around Cacak. 50X1-HUM
