- In early January 1901 the Chinese Communists sent 5,000 tons of rice to Macac for shipment to Ecus Kong. YALG Tuo yun (点 文章) of the Ho Ch'un (全章) Company in Cantor was responsible for the shipping. YANG is head of the Chinese Communist Transportation Section in Chungshan and was the first person in Chung han to become rich through handling shipments for the Communists. O 3 January he transported 4,800 bags of rice to Macac, making delivery at v3 Tai Ping Warehouse. The Man Kuang Trading Company\* handled the transportation from there, loading the rice on the SS TE HSING (色星) for hong Korg. On 9 January 1,500 bags of rice were loaded on three barges which were lowed to Lumber 5 Wharf, Macaco, and unloaded at the Tai Ping
- 2. On the mint of 16 January 1951, 12 barges towed by a motorboat transported 4,000 be; of rice from Chungshan to macao, where the rice was stored in Public Frehouses 5 and 6.
- 3. On 19 / mary 1951 the SS CLUN HSING () arrived in macao towing 14 boats aded with 700,000 catties of rice. According to YANG Shih-cheng\*\* this rise was to be turned over to ar. FU () of the Man Kuang Company, to be xchanged for gasoline and machinery. On the same day at Kumber 32 Whar large quantities of machinery, 300 boxes of medicines, and 1,640 drum; of gasoline were loaded boats which were probably to be towed back to Capul by the CHUN LSING on 21 January. One hundred tires (34 x 7 and 32 / 6), and 100 automobile engines were also being loaded on 20 January.
- 4. A conding to YANG Shin-cheng, 900,000 piculs (sic) of rice, loaded on seven arge boats, was due to arrive in Chungshan on 21 January 1951. After extens and other clearances, this rice was to be shipped to Hong Kong in exchange for war materials.\*\*\*
- 5. On 26 January 1951 nine boat loads of rice, totaling more than 1,700,000 catties, arrived at Chrienshan (113-32, 22-14) from Canton. This rice was turned over to LeU Te (氣) 震) of the Nan Luang Trading Company in exchange for gasoline, tires and other items.
