

- On 25 February 1951, 500 napalm bombs arrived in the Fukien and Chekiang coastal areas from Hankow, where there is a napalm bomb factory.
- In early March local militia on Tungshantao (117-31, 23-45) evacuated the island on orders from the administrative commissioner's office in that area,*
- In mid-March at Tungshantao there were one battalion of the 31 Army, 500 militiamen and 200 former members of the Nationalist salt revenue police who had defected to the Chinese Communists.*
- The main force of the 103 Division, 35 Army, arrived at Wenchou (120-38, 28-01) from Chinhua (119-39, 29-07).
- 5. Troops of the "849 Unit" were in towns along the Shanghai-Hangchow railroad.
- Elements of the 31 Army were in the Amoy area training in amphibious operations.
- The 15 Public Security Division was in Shanghai.

- The 105 Division, 35 Army, was temporarily placed under the command of the 21 Army. On 22 March elements of the 315 Regiment, 105 Division, arrived at Huangtaao (121-06, 27-59). On 23 March the second battalion of the 307 Regiment, 103 Division, left Huangtaao for Juian.
- Between 15 and 18 March an army of the 3 Field Army moved from Shanghai to the Ningpo (121-32, 29-54) area via Hangchow.

- 10. On 23 March one company of an artillery battalion of the 29 Army was at Ch'angmen (119-33, 26-09). Another was at Tungt'ai (119-37, 26-14) and a third at Huangohi (120-21, 27-08).
- 11. On 24 March elements of the 65 Division, 21 Army, were scheduled to move from Julen (120-58, 27-49) to an undetermined area.
- 12. In early March there were 2,000 large barrels of white gasoline stored in Shanghai at the site of the former incineration grounds at Pao Hsing () Road West. They were well camouflaged and enclosed in wire netting. There were pillboxes at all gates.
- 13. The Julan, Pingyang (120-33, 27-42) (sic) and Foothow harbors were closed by the authorities, and residents of these areas were being compelled to evacuate.
- M. All defenses being constructed on the Peiling Peninsula (120-00, 26-24) to Minchiangk'ou (119-36, 26-08) were almost completed.
- 15. LIU Yueh-jo (如 並 若) commander the Linhai (121-07, 28-53) Military District. CHANG Tzu-cheng (美子正) is deputy commander. The Linhai Guard Regiment is subordinate to this district command.
- 16. Headquarters of the East Fukien Inlitery District is at Fuan (119-38, 27-04) under the command of CH*EN Ting (读述), KANG Yun-ming and TSEMG Ya-mao (多玉茂) are deputy commanders. WU Li-hsia (美土夏) is political director.
- 17. On 23 Merch one battalion of the garrison regiment of the Fukien Military District was at Mingte (119-53, 26-39). Another battalion was at Tung-ch'ung (119-52, 26-33). The rest of the regiment was at Fuon-
