1. The Chinese Ambassador in Moscow is reported to have stated the following:  
Chinese-Soviet relations are not very good; the Soviet Union entangled  
China in the Korean War and has not given the aid promised. In February 1951,  
MAO Tse-tung met Georgi M. Malenkov in Harbin, where MAO aired his com- 50X1-HUM  
plaints. Malenkov stated that if the Soviet Union should enter the campaign,  
it would result in World War III to the detriment of China and the USSR.  
Malenkov wanted to continue wearing down the West on various fronts. MAO  
did not press his views and agreed to accept only the supply of China with  
material from Soviet-Japanese surpluses. 50X1-HUM
