1. The battalion [redacted] in Slovenia has [redacted] been identified [redacted] as 6 KNOJ Battalion composed of four companies of 100 men each. 50X1-HUM
2. A State arsenal in Kragujevac is reported to be manufacturing a Yugoslav machine gun which is closely patterned after the German Model 42. 50X1-HUM
3. [redacted] the number which appears on the military booklet carried by all conscripts contains a key designating the branch of the army to which the bearer is accredited. The following are some of the key numbers and their significance:
- 1 - 15 infantry
 - 23 - 50 artillery
 - 51 - 60 armored forces
 - 70 - 100 supply
 - 100 - 115 aviation
4. A Major General Petauer is reported to have replaced Lieutenant General Mihaljo Apostolski as Commander of the Sixth Army.
