SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO.

The following list of political and semi-political organizations and newspapers in the Ho Chi Minh-controlled zones of Vietnam has been compiled from overt sources and is disseminated as a general summary of their history from the founding of the Viet Minh in 1941 to its merger with the lien Viet in early 1951.

## ORGANIZATIONS

#### 1. The Viet Minh League.

Founded in 1941 by the Communist Party of Indochina (PCI) as a broadbased militant nationalist movement and comprising workers', youth, peasants' and women's Mational Salvation Associations which were formed simultaneously.

The Viet Minh was not only a political but a military organization and the members of the Union of Youth for Mational Salvation formed the first unit of what was later to be the Viet Minh National Army. In 1949 Viet Minh propaganda began to urge that the Viet Minh League should be merged with the Lien Viet and by the end of 1950 this process was completed on the lower levels while at the top the joint Viet Minhlien Viet Committee had been formed. The Viet Minh was finally marged with the lien Viet in February 1951 and the League as a separate body disappeared.

## 3. Union of Victnamese Youth.

Founded in 1941 with the Viet Minh as Youth Fighting for National Salvation, with the special task of spreading propagands on behalf of the Viet Minh. Its first military propagands unit composed of 43 members was formed under Vo Mguyen Giap. Later this unit became the first unit of the Vietnam Liberation Army.

According to Leo Figueres who visited the Viet Minh in 1950 it wielded deep influence in nearly all factories, districts, army units and government services.



"The Vietnam Laodong Party comes into being at a time when the whole Vietnamese people are longing for a Venguerd Party, a General Staff, a powerful, clear-sighted and genuinely revolutionary political Party, in order to lead the Resistance in the preparation for a general counteroffensive and in the launching of a victorious general counteressensive.

"As the policy of the Farty is to work for the interests of the country and meonle, to place the interests of the country and people above all, and as it embraces the most determined and model citizens of the Resistance, the Vietnam Landong Party is the most patriotic Party, the Party of the workers and toiling masses, and also the Party of the people. Its leader is also the leader of the people, our beloved President, Ho Chi Mirh.

"The newly-born Vietnam Laodong Party consequently takes its responsibility before the people and history: to lead the Resistance to victory and national reconstruction to success, and to make Vietnam an independent, free, democratic and prosperous country. The Vietnamese people as a while are confident that the Vietnam Laodong Party is endowed with necessary qualities and abilities, with enough determination and clear-sightedness,

## 19. Peolao Issara.

"National Liberation Front of Laos" founded in August 1950 to work for the independence of Laos in cooperation with the Viet Minh and the Democratic Peoples of the World.

November

1950: At a conference at which representatives from the Lien Viet and the "National United Fronts" of Laos and Cambodia were present it was decided that a Joint National United Front should be set up and a Preparatory Committee was elected.

March

1951: At the lien Viet Congress for the merging of the Viet Minh it was indicated by President No Chi Minh that the "National Fronts" of Laos and Cambodia had been united with the Lien Viet. Nevertheless, neither the Chairman of the United Front of Laos, Prince Souphannavong nor his Cambodian colleague Son Ngoc Minh was elected Vice Chairman or even to the Standing Committee.

#### 20. United Issarak Front or Mouta Seiha.

Founded after a Congress of Cambodian resistance leaders in April 1950 with the object of obtaining Cambodian independence in cooperation with the Viet Minh.

Its relations with the Viet Mini have followed the same course as that of Meolao Issara (see 19). Its President, Son Ngoc Minh, was not present at the March Congress of the Lien Viet, and was represented by Chang Smay, the Vice President of the Front.
