REMARKS

The three barracks installations in Kis Kun Malas (Y 6/N 70) were used for military purposes in April 1951. They were called the New Barracks, the Old Bicycle Barracks, and the New Barracks at the Tobacco Factory. In the so-called New Barracks, which was built about 1949, all draftees from the Kis Kun Malas area were temporarily quartered and from there reassigned to other units. The Old Bicycle Barracks, which was built about 1935, quartered soldiers, probably infantrymen, who wore green service color. The New Barracks at the Tobacco Factory, where construction work was done in early 1951, was occupied by troops with red service color whom local residents referred to as light artillerymen. The post ammunition depot was located about 1 km northwest of the New Barracks. *
