- 1. During Lay 1951, 360 tons of tung oil was exported from Communist China to hong dong; during early June an additional 500 tons was shipped. Most of the tung oil was then shipped from Long Kong to Australia, Japan and South Africa, Australia receiving the largest amount.
- 2. The Man Kuang Company made the following shipments by water from macao to Kongmoon:
  - a. 12 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 600 drums of kerosene, 20 drums of coal tar and 9\* tons of crude rubber.
  - b. 13 June: 30 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 30 drums of residue fats, 60 truck tires and 11 tons of iron rods.
  - c. 14 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 60 tires and 13\* tons of crude rubber.
  - d. 15 June: 50 drums of gasoline, 500 drums of kerosene, 30 drums of residue fats, 60 truck tires, 4 boxes of medicine and 13\* tons of scrap
  - s. 16 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, and 11 tons of crude rubber.
  - f. 17 June: 60 drums of gasoline, 800 drums of kerosene, 10\* tons of crude rubber and 13\* tons of scrap iron.
  - g. 18 June: 50 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 60 truck tires, 3 boxes of medicine and ll\* tons of scrap iron.

- 3. The Nan Kuang Company made the following shipments by water from Macao to Canton:
  - a. 13 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 600 drums of karosene, 290 truck tires and 13 tons of crude rubber.
  - b. 14 June: 200 drums of gasoline, 200 drums of coal tar, 50 sheets of iron plate and 64 sheets of lead plate.
  - c. 15 June: 26 truck tires, 18\* tons of crude rubber and one large truck.
  - d. 16 June: 50 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 60 tons of coal tar, 680 sets of tires, 4 boxes of medicine and 22 sheets of iron plate.
- 4. The Nan Kuang Company made the following shipments by water from Macao to Shinch'i:
  - a. 12 June: 50 drums of gasoline, c0 drums of kerosene and 9\* tons of crude rubber.
  - b. 13 June: 250 drums of gasoline.
  - c. 15 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 3 drums of residue fats, 11 tons of orude rubber and 13\* tons of iron rods.
  - d. 16 June: 40 drums of gasoline, 10 drums of residue fats and 14\* tons of crude rubber.
  - e. 17 June: 350 drums of gasoline, 700 drums of kerosene, 20 drums of residue fats and 80 truck tires.
- 5. On 21 June the following sup: lies which had arrived in Canton from hong Kong and macac were at the Huangsha Railroad Station, Canton, awaiting shipment north by rail: 500 drums of gasoline, 20 22-ton trucks and 600 sets of tires.
