Trains [redacted] run to Brest-Litovsk via Czeremcha. Trains [redacted] run to Brest-Litovsk via Terespol. Train [redacted] is the international express train [redacted] to Warsaw [redacted] and Berlin. Trains [redacted]

[redacted] serve short distance passenger and freight traffic. Train [redacted] is reserved for unwieldy goods exceeding international loading measurements. Trains [redacted]

[redacted] are leave trains and operate between Frankfurt/Oder and Brest-Litovsk. Train [redacted] which runs three times a week, operates only if required by the volume of leave traffic. [redacted] Express train

[redacted] which is used only by Soviets, operates daily between Berlin and Brest Litovsk. It is also called the Blue Express. [redacted]

[redacted] Trains [redacted] alternate, and only one operates on any given day.

Comment.

[redacted] eastbound rail traffic via Frankfurt/Oder. The daily volume of Soviet eastbound traffic is fixed at 1 express train, 2 leave trains, and 13 freight trains. [redacted] all these trains were included in [redacted] all Soviet transit traffic through Poland.

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
