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Comment. The average number of railroad cars loaded in the Soviet Zone of Germany is 21,000 per day. In the tabulation, a breakdown for only the most important bulk goods is given. The use of these cars by the Soviets is very high. This may be caused by the transfer of Soviet units from their military be caused by the transfer of Soviet units from their military posts to troop training areas which is now under way.

Comment. The number of eastbound trains passing through Frankfurt/Oder on 19 April greatly exceeds the average of 10 to 13 trains daily. The unusually high volume of eastbound traffic may be because of a backlog of trains accumulated during preceding days.

Comment. This border crossing point is of only local importance for traffic on the Zittau (N 53/V 03)-Goerlitz (0 52/B 00) railroad line.

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
