

Westbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Yerevan: Two trains composed of 15 passenger cars, three cars carrying four engines, six cars carrying boxes of ammunition, two tank cars, and 36 closed cars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Yerevan to Nakhichevan; Two trains composed of 12 tank cars, four coal cars, two cars carrying ten motors, one car carrying boxes of ammunition, one carload of iron, 34 closed cars, and 15 passenger cars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa: Twontrains composed of 20 passenger cars, with guards stationed at the car doors, six tank cars, and eleven closed cars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa: Four trains composed of 15 passenger cars, with guards stationed at the car doors, 25 tank cars, 23 closed cars, and 30 passenger cars.

7 June

A black twin-engine Soviet fighter aircraft flew over the Araxes river and observed the Araxes region to a width of approximately 2,000 meters.

8 June

9 June

Westbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Yerevan: Two trains composed of 15 passenger cars, three cars carrying poles, one carload of stones, one car carrying four engines, one carload of iron pipes, and 16 closed cars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Yerevan to Nakhichevan: Two trains composed of 15 passenger cars, two carloads of stone, one tank car, and 26 closed cars.

Westbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: Two trains composed of 16 passenger cars, five coal cars, three tank cars, one carload of wire, two cars carrying poles, and 23 closed cars.

6 June 1100 hours

A Soviet exchange train arrived at Iranian Dzhulfa with 41 tons of cement. The train returned at 1720 hours, pulling seven empty cars and one car loaded with 16 tons of raisins.

7 June

In the vicinity of Soviet Dzhulfa, the Soviets have started digging trenches. Something (possibly mines) is put into the trenches and then covered with soil. Approximately 10 to 20 feet in front of the trenches, wooden pegs have been installed and a thin wire has been fixed to the pegs.

8 June

Westbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: One train composed of 13 boxcars and 24 gondolas carrying planks.

Eastbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa and Ordubad: Two trains composed of 51 boxears, 15 gondolas and five tank cars.

night

Direction unstated: Two trains of unknown make-up.

Direction unstated: Two passenger trains, number of cars unstated.

Weatbound road traffic, Ordubad to Dzhulfa and Nakhichevan: Seventy-six trucks carrying 61 soldiers; three jeeps and two autos.

Direction unstated: Three trains of unknown make-up.

Eastbound road traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa to Ordubad: Thirty trucks, ten autos, and three jeeps were observed carrying 58 soldiers.

Westbound road traffic, Ordubad to Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: Thirty-two trucks, one auto, and one jeep were observed carrying 43 troops.

Opposite Iranian Ahmadabad, Soviet soldiers were observed digging in the ground.

ll June

Westbound rail traffic, Ordubad to Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: One train composed of 24 boxcars and two gondolas loaded with coal.

Eastbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Ordubad: Two trains composed of 61 boxcars and five gondolas loaded with stones; two trains according to schedule (sic); and four night trains of unknown make-up.

Westbound road traffic, Ordubad to Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: Twenty-seven trucks carrying 37 soldiers and two boxes.

Eastbound road traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa: Twenty-seven trucks carrying 72 soldiers.

Two hundred soldiers trained north of Dzhulfa.

13 June

Westbound rail traffic, Ordubad to Dzhulfa to Nakhichevan: Two trains composed of 30 boxcars, five tank cars and one passenger car carrying 75 civilians.

Eastbound rail traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa to Ordubad: Two trains composed of four passenger cars.

Direction unstated: Three passenger trains according to schedule and five night trains of unknown make-up.

Eastbound road traffic, Nakhichevan to Dzhulfa: Twenty trucks, one jeep, and one automobile.

Forty soldiers engaged in military training and maneuvers and ten soldiers dug trenches.

13 and 14 June

Three trains arrived at Iranian Dzhulfa from Soviet Dzhulfa. The trains delivered 185 tons of sugar and then returned.

3. Sia Rud 5 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 47 covered cars, nine tank cars, 75 gondolas containing lumber, red soil, and coal, and three cars containing iron bars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 14 passenger cars and 41 gondolas.

6 and 7 June

Rail traffic, direction unstated: Six trains composed of 23 boxcars, 15 tank cars, 185 gondolas containing timber, red soil, and coal, eight gondolas containing iron bars, and six gondolas containing trucks and white gunny sacks with unknown contents.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Six Grains composed of 14 passenger cars, 14 box-cars, and 12 gondolas containing one crane, lumber, and timbers.

9 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Four trains composed of 59 covered cars, 31 gondolas containing planks, timber, and lumber, two autos; four tank cars and 14 passenger cars.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 47 boxcars, 24 gondolas of which eight carried engines, the remainder carried lumber, coal, and planks; 14 passenger cars and three tank cars.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 14 passenger cars and four boxcars.

11 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 39 boxcars, 15 tank cars, 26 goneolas among which seven engines were observed, and one car full of soldiers.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dahulfa: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 43 box-cars, six tank cars, and 41 gondolas loaded with two trucks, one auto, lumber, coal, and white soil.

12 June

westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 47 covered cars, nine tank cars, 22 cars carrying poles, lumber, and white soil, four cars carrying tractors, and one drezina (a car which looks like an automobile with wheels permitting the vehicle to run on rails) pulling three gondolas containing 12 civilians.

13 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 31 covered cars, four tank cars and 20 gondolas carrying iron pipes, red soil, coal, timbers, and gravel.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 15 passenger cars, five boxcars, and 120 gondolas containing planks.

14 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 36 box-cars, 15 tank cars, and 24 gondolas containing iron pipes, timbers, and coal.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 18 covered cars, one tank car, eight gondolas containing gravel; one truck fitted with flange wheels permitting it to run along the rails towed one gondola car containing ten armed soldiers.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 47 boxcars, 76 tank cars, and 24 gondolas containing boxes, timber, and wood.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: One train composed of 14 boxcars, two tank cars and 13 gondolas.

6 and 7 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Seven trains composed of 28 passenger cars, eight cars carrying soldiers, 36 tank cars, 14 boxcars, 49 gondolas containing cases, wood, and planks, and 13 empty gondolas.

8 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: One train composed of 19 boxcars, ten tank cars, 16 empty gondolas, and nine gondolas containing wood and poles.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 35 boxcars, eight tank cars, ten empty gondolas, three gondolas containing cases and machine tools, and 14 passenger cars.

9 June

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: One train composed of 15 tank cars, one gondola containing coal, one gondola containing tables and chairs, 32 gondolas containing wood, timbers, and coal.

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Three trains composed of 27 boxcars, 16 tank cars, four gondolas, and 14 passenger cars.

10 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Four trains composed of 36 boxcars, 26 tank cars, two gondolas containing cases, 22 empty gondolas, and 14 passenger cars.

ll June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Three trains composed of 14 passenger cars, 24 boxcars, ten tank cars, two gondolas containing stones, and 14 empty gondolas.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Two trains composed of 22 boxcars, 14 gondolas containing wood and coal, one empty gondola, and three tank cars.

12 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Three trains composed of 22 boxcars, 13 gondolas, 11 tank cars, 34 freight cars, and 13 passenger cars.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: One train composed of 24 gondolas and 40 freight cars.

2300 hours

One white rocket was fired from the Soviet post opposite Khuda Afarin.

13 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Three trains composed of 14 tank cars, 301 boxcars, three gondolas containing bricks, three gondolas containing cases, two gondolas with equipment, six gondolas loaded with wood, four empty gondolas, and 14 passenger cars.

14 June

Eastbound rail traffic, Dzhulfa to Baku: Two trains composed of 22 cars full of soldiers, 15 passenger cars, 11 tank cars, and six gondolas.

Westbound rail traffic, Baku to Dzhulfa: Two trains composed of 18 tank cars, 39 gondolas containing one crane, planks, and stones.

5. Garmi 7 June

Marked activity was observed in the Garmi sector. The number of night patrols has been increased. The repair and construction of a road between Dizdar (possibly the previously reported but unlocated Dizdarvi) and Aghche (possibly Achtche, 39-01N, 48-25E) is now completed and trucks are now using this road.

About 700 women took part in a big meeting opposite Iranian Garmi. At the conclusion of the meeting, speeches were delivered. The meeting was under the supervision of two officers, three soldiers, and four civilians.

6. Namin 5 June

Road traffic: Five trucks carrying phanks moved from Gaduk (38-35N, 48-20E) towards Omstomnok and one truck with unidentified load moved from the village of Cloose to the Cloose border post.

7 and 8 June

Road traffic: Five trucks loaded with white sacks moved from the village of Gaduk to Omstomnok, Kizilissa (38-33N, 48-30E) and Kalaputi (38-48N, 48-25E). After unloading, they returned to Gaduk.

A group of Soviet soldiers engaged in light machine gun firing practice at the post of Sholecheran.

9 June

Road traffic: Two jeeps moved from Kizilissa to Kalaputi. One truck moved from Gaduk to Constonnok.

A small bivouac was observed two kilometers southeast of the Kalaputi post.

Fersonnel strength at the Soviet post of Malayurd was increased from 35 men to 45 men.

11 June

Road traffic: One jeep and two trucks moved from Kizilissa to Kalaputi and four trucks loaded with foodstuffs moved from Gaduk to Omstonnok.

One truck carrying 16 soldiers arrived at the Kalaputi post. Two jeeps arrived at the same time. The new arrivals gathered at the guards resthcuse. Sixteen saddled horses were observed standing behind the resthouse.

7. Astara 2 through & June

Southbound road traffic, Lenkoran to Astara: Eight jeeps, two autos, and 15 trucks with unknown contents; three armed soldiers on foot.

Northbound road traffic, Astara to Lenkoran: Two jeeps, two autos and 14 trucks with unknown contents; a few armed soldiers on foot.

Eastbound road traffic, last post west to Masjed Mahalleh: Two jeeps, two motorcycles, one truck, and four carts carrying five officers, three sergeants, four armed soldiers, and ten civilians; eight armed soldiers on foot.

One jeep and one auto went from the Astara Border Guard HQ toward Bagehen Sareh. The occupants inspected the border area. One jeep and one auto carrying seven civilians visited Khoshkeh Dahaneh (not located) and the occupants carefully examined the border region.

One officer, two sergeants, three soldiers, and five civilians went toward Bagchen Sareh and visited the area bordering on Iran.

Three officers accompanied by five civilians came to the frontier bridge at Astara and from there carefully examined the coast and Iranian Astara.

Light soldiers and one sergeant repaired barbed wire along the frontier and laid down some rockets (sic).

Fifteen white rockets and one red rocket were fired at Haidar Mahalleh (not located), Kenyar Darya (not located), and Astara. Searchlight: activity during the night was intermittent. Twelve rockets were fired opposite Bagchen Sareh. Seven white rockets were fired opposite Khoshkeh Dahaneh.

Southbound road traffic, Lenkoran to Astara: Three jeeps and seven trucks carrying a few persons.

Northbound road traffic, Astara to Lenkopan: he Four trucks and a few soldiers.

Westbound road traffic, Astara to Masjed Mahalleh: One sergeant riding a motorcycle; one jeep, two trucks, and one cart carrying two officers, five unarmed soldiers, two sergeants, and ten filled gunny sacks.

Eastbound road traffic, Masjed Mahalleh to Astara: Two jeeps and one cart carrying five officers, three sergeants, four soldiers, some gunny sacks, and one box.
