- (4) It is possible that demobilized personnel were still returned to the USSR or recruits shipped to the Soviet Zone of Germany during May. Such an assumption finds some support in the fact that preparations for quartering troops were observed in Bad Freienwalde. These preparations were to be completed by 20 May 1951. 
- (5) These are the first shipments of German freight cars to be returned from the USSR.  25X1
- (6) The report continues and supplements previous information.  25X1
 The shipments of manganese may have been dispatched to the new foundry combine "Eisenwerke West" near Calbe on the Saale River (M 52/D 77). All the shipments of iron and steel products to Magdeburg and Chemnitz-Hilbersdorf may have been earmarked for the border fortifications in the Letzling Heath and Saxony/Thuringia. The shipments to Chemnitz-Hilbersdorf (N 51/K 66) have increased so much since February 1951 that the requirements of the Uranium Mining Syndicate must be exceeded. The refrigerator cars observed on 15 May were reparations deliveries. At the Soviet transfer points, the cars will be mounted on Soviet-gauge axles, which accompany the cars. The two shipments from Boehlen to Khabinka are deliveries from the Boehlen Hydrogenation Plant. The data on the ore shipment on 21 May in paragraph 1, and the shipments listed in paragraph 3 relate to uranium ore shipments.
