Comments

- (1) Shuttle-train No 115 was first observed in Kuestrin on 17 June 1951, en route from Weimar to the east, carrying discharges. Since, according to the present report, it was again observed en route to the U.S.S.R. on 22 June, it is believed that the train brought recruits from the U.S.S.R. to the Soviet Zone of Germany in the intervening time.
- (2) Shuttle-train No 113 was previously reported as being en route to the U.S.S.R. via Kuestrin on 22 June. The return of the train on 28 June is reported for the first time.
- (3) The information confirms that shuttle-train No 113 carried troops from Kuestrin-border to Jueterbog on 24 June 1951. See this information however, was doubted. Two sources reported that shuttle-train No 13 loaded with troops and empty when en route to the U.S.S.R. on 26 and/or 27 June. Since the present report states that the train was empty, this statement seems credible.
- (4) Shuttle-train No 114 left the Soviet Zone of Germany empty on 23 June. See
- (5) Shuttle-train No 108 went empty from Frankfurt/Oder to Werbig on 26 June and, then, was probably redispached to Bad Freienwalde to pick up discharges and to take them to Insterburg via Kuestrin on 29 June.
- (6) Another source reported that shuttle-train No 109 left Jueterbog empty for Cottbus on 20 June 1951.

- (7) Empty shuttle-train No 107 was last observed on 15 June en route from Dresden to Brest Litovsk. [REDACTED] 25X1A
It is doubted that the train consisted of only 25 boxcars on 25 June.
- (8) Shuttle-train No 112 was last observed on 14 June while passing through Kuestrin loaded with troops and proceeding toward Frankfurt/Oder. The present report on shuttle-train No 112 does not include its activities from 14 to 27 June and it is evident that the train must have made an additional trip to the U.S.S.R. during this period.
- (9) The train possibly carried elements of the unidentified AAA Div, possibly the 32d ?, of the GDFG that were brought to the Gusefrow AAA range from Kuestrin via Iberswalde. Since shipment-record Nos of the 75xxx series are used only in interzonal rail traffic, it is doubtful that the trains actually passed through the Kuestrin border-crossing point. No 19578 may be a train number.
- (10) Individual tanks were reported to have arrived in Frankfurt/Oder from the U.S.S.R. on 21, 22 and 27 June. These tanks were to be issued to the various units from there. See [REDACTED]
- (11) Shuttle-train No 106 was last observed on 19 and 20 June en route with troops from Kuestrin to Rathenow. [REDACTED] 25X1A
