		A barracks installation containing a two-story brick building and several other buildings of various materials was situated at the intersection of ul. Bema (north side) and ul. They occupied the barracks installation on the south side of the road to Lancut, opposite the KBW Barracks; the barracks installation on the north side of ul.
