1. The Confederacion de Jovenes Mexicanos (CJM) has been extremely active lately. In addition to selecting and sending delegates to the Berlin Festival and the Warsaw conference, it has taken steps to reorganize its groups in normal, rural, and vocational schools, and in the Instituto Politecnico Nacional.
2. In co-operation with the state committees of the Partido Popular (PP), the CJM is preparing numerous meetings throughout the country to re-activate its present groups and to form new groups.
3. The CJM's most important task at the present time is to prepare for its IV National Congress, which will reportedly take place on 16 October 1951 at [REDACTED]. The organizers of the IV Congress are:

Plans for the IV Congress are under the supervision of Vicente Lombardo Toledano, who reportedly approved the following points which the CJM will discuss during the Congress:

- a. Co-operate in the peace activities and in forming brigades for the collection of at least 100,000 peace signatures; supply propaganda explaining the need for peace to the youth of Mexico; be ready at all times to assist the Mexican peace movement.
- b. Maintain the fight against imperialism, particularly U.S. imperialism; meetings for the purpose of denouncing the U.S. as an aggressor nation and an enemy of Mexico.
- c. Unite with all allied organizations throughout the world, particularly with the World Federation of Democratic Youth (WFDY) and the International Students' Union (ISU).
- d. Plan action against the Secretariat of Education in support of better living conditions for students in boarding schools.

- e. Condemn the Federacion de Partidos del Pueblo Mexicano for attempting to draw support from the CNR's rank and file and pledge loyalty to the PP.
 - f. Support the basic platform of the PP.
 - g. Co-operate with the PP in its presidential campaign.
 - h. Work for better conditions for youth in all walks of life, such as students, peasants, working class.
 - i. Fight against stand taken by the U.S. in Korea; support Red China in its anti-imperialistic struggle.
 - j. Support Mexico's economic independence and its industrialization.
 - k. Support the independent movement of all colonial peoples.
 - l. Campaign against the attempt of the Secretariat of Education to keep students out of politics.
 - m. Oppose re-election.
4. The IV Congress will open with a demonstration against the Secretariat of Education. A request for larger subsidies to technical schools will be made at that time.
