3. In early 1951, 360 motor transport field kitchens and 50 horse-drawn ones were stored in the winter harbor. (2)
4. In early June 1951, the scrap metal stored in three rooms of a storehouse was removed. By 23 June 1951, 330 tons rye flour, which allegedly was to be kept as a reserve stock until the fall of 1951, was stored there. By early July 1951, 105 15-ton carloads of wheat flour and 37 15-ton carloads of rye flour were stored in the storehouse vacated for flour storage. [redacted] the flour was to be stored until the fall of 1951. In early 1951, one more storehouse was completely emptied, cleaned and disinfected. [redacted] the storehouse, whose capacity was estimated at 630 tons, was to store flour. The flour was expected to arrive from Turzen after 9 July 1951 and was allegedly to supply the Biesa post. (3)
5. In late May 1951, the air raid trench shelters in the Frankfurt/Oder army ration supply depot, which had decayed, were reconditioned. On 9 June 1951, the 50-man guard detail of the army ration supply depot was relieved and allegedly transferred to the U.S.S.R. The officer in charge of the depot, who was on leave up

to 6 July 1951, had not yet returned for duty by the end of the time of observation. (u)

[redacted] Comments.

(1) The present report confirms the large-size 620th Ration Supply Depot of the GORC [redacted] and furnishes more details on incoming and outgoing rail-road shipments. [redacted]

(2) A previous report of 20 March 1951 estimated the number of the field kitchens and field bakeries stored in the two storehouses at the winter harbor at 300 field kitchens and 25 field bakeries. [redacted]

(3) The storing of flour may be connected with shipments from Mest Litovsk. The storing of flour may be connected with shipments to equalize the grain stores in the U.S.S.R. and the Soviet Zone of Germany which was carried out from mid-February to mid-July 1951. [redacted]

(4) A previous report had confirmed Lieutenant Colonel Kellinik, (fnu), as officer in charge of the ration supply depot up to 18 May 1951. See paragraph 1, [redacted]
