e. Hoff3, in charge of the Soviet information service in Macao, sent his division chiefs, CH'EN Man 10, PAO Wei-had (影紅道) and LIU Shang-chin (名) 请之) to Hong Kong.

Soviet Intelligence, Hong Kong and Lacac

- 2. In July 1951 Yapilov, military attache at the Soviet consulate general in Canton, assigned LI Wu-nung () as liaison officer to keep in touch with WU Te-hsien 11. Intelligence agent in Hong Kong. LI traveled regularly between Lacao and Hong Kong in pursuing his duties, occasionally disguising himself for his contacts with WU in the political department of Hong Kong Folice meadquarters, Oriental Building. Contaught Road Tentral.
- 3. On 10 July hoff instructed CH'EN man to prepare or obtain five entry permits for Taiwan and five for Japan, to be used for the infiltration of agents. CH'EN Man sent his trusted assistant, Ch'EN Lu (FF F), to Hong Kong to attend to this matter. Ch'EN Lu uses the Luk Kwok Restaurant, Gloucester Road, manchai, as his address for contacts in Hong Long.
- 4. Nubelow instructed Ch'EN I-shong 12 to produce five entry permits for persons of either Portuguese or Chinese nationality going to the United States. He also instructed CH'FN on plans for inducing young Portuguese men to ally themselves with the Chinese Communists.
- 5. Hoff ordered KAN Kuang⁴, vice chairman of the Macao Labor rederation, to accelerate the recruiting of young laborers for the international Communist underground organization. Taking advantage of the growing unemployment in Macao, KAN recruited 55 young men from the Tea House and Bakers' Union, Seamen's Union, Shoemakers' Union, Automobile Workers' Union, Machinists' Union and Woodcarvers' Union. These recruits were divided into three groups for training classes, to be held twice a week at the Macao Labor Federation, under the direction of a cadra sent by Hoff.
- 6. In mid-July MIN Lu-ill was directing her efforts mainly toward members of the upper and middle classes in Macao, and was trying to enlist the help of HO Hsien 13 and LIANG th'ang in this connection. In her recruiting smeng young students, MIN was assisted by SU Man-ming (家 课)。22 years of age.
 - 7. In early July 1951 LTU heng-chung 2 instructed his staff members, hUANG K'eng 2, P'AN Kung-haiso, P'AN Lin 13, TENG Chen-haising 14 and Ch'IEN Ching-lin 15, separately, to make contacts with the personnel on steamships plying between Hong hong and bacae for the purpose of getting information on American visitors to Macao. LIANG Ch'ang approved this plan of LIU's, and hoff instructed LIU to procure two speed cameras for taking pictures of all such visitors.
 - 8. In mid-July there was an underground station directly supervised by Hoff at 77 Avenida Almirante Lacerda, first floor. It was managed by LIU Cho-ch'un (1) 5), a native of Chungshan District, 29 years old. Ch'EN Man often visited the place and took part in its activities.
 - 9. Macouetdy16, former head of Soviet intelligence in macso, is a Soviet citizen and more than 30 years of age. he was formerly an intelligence officer in the Soviet Army. In 1947 he was appointed to the staff of Communist International Far East Headquarters (sic). At the beginning of 1950 he was sent to Centon, and transferred to in July 1950. He had 15 agents transferred to Macso from hankow and Canton. During August and September 1950, five agents were sent to Taiwan, three to Japan, four to the Philippines, and three to Indochina. These agents had had two years of training under Soviet army officers.

10. LIU Heng-chung, a division chief in the international Communist intelligence organization, is at the same time secretary in the Macso Government's political and economic intelligence service, a director of the Macso Food Dealers' Association, and assistant managing director of the No Chi Company, he is 48 years old, and a native of Sanshui (112-54, 23-08) District, Kwangtung Province. He once worked as a reporter, and for a short time was manager of the Chieng Pao, after which he obtained a position under HIANG Chiang in the Macso Government service. Dr. K*O Lin persuaded LIU to defect to the Chiese Communists in the summer of 1948, and CH*EN Man secured his services for international Communist intelligence. LIU's intelligence reports, which are submitted to LIANG Thiang, are distributed to Lobo, the SCSB organization under YUAN Heiso⁶, the international Communist intelligence office, and the Pearl River Special Commissioner's Office in Shihoh'i. 17

- 13. T'AN Kuc-chi (), an intelligence worker under I U T'ich-ful8, works mainly among the upper and middle classes and has many social contacts with Americans. He is 26 years old and a native of the East River District. His address is 194 Ki Lung Street, first floor, wowlern.
- 14. In July 1951 there was an intelligence agency of the Kwangtung District Military Headquarters on the second floor at 647 Shanghai Street, Kowloon. The officer in charge was FAN I (12, 2, 3), 32 years old and a native of the Esinan (112-55, 23-09) District, Kwangtung Province. FAN is a member of the Chinese Communist Party and has been engaged in underground work in hong Kong and Kowloon for a number of years.
- 15. LIU Kang-fong sent EO Yuan-hua () to Hong Aong to investigate the anti-Communist activities of the American consulate general. HO is 23 years old and a Cantonese. She was trained for intelligence work in Moscow and speaks English, French and Russian. In Hong Aong her contact address is 223 Wing Lok Street, first floor.
- 16. P'ENG Chao⁶, chief of the Second Division of the SCSB Hong Kong station, has three sections of nine members each under his direction. He has offices at 123 Connaught Road Central, second floor, and at 172 Nathan Road, second floor, Kowloon.

17. MA Wan-ch'i, head of the Fourth Division of the CSCB Macao Station, uses the following addresses for contacts: Ta Hua Company, 1 Rua da Caldeira; first floor, 10 Large de S. Domingos; hai beng Shipting Company, 87 Rua Visconde Paco de Arcos. YU hung-chun? Is one of his staff members.

- 18. CHANG Lang appointed LIANG Fan-tan19 as his intelligence officer. LIANG is a teacher in the P'ei Ching widdle School and speaks English.
- 19. EUARG Chien-lung, of the SCSB Macao station, delegated his deputy, CHANG Let. to contact OU Hua?, of the political department of the Macao Police, to enlist his services. CHANG contacts OU at the Gverseas Chinese Athletic Association. 10 Travessa dos Colonos.
- 20. The SCSB Macao station ordered CHU Chin-ping19, chief of the Industrial and Commercial Division, to send his underground workers to make a survey and inventory of all strategic materials stored in Macao. Photographs were to be taken of the stores. On the basis of this information, the SCSB station put pressure on the firms owning the supplies to force them to sell the goods to the Chinese Communists.
