Movements.

3. Four artillery units moved into the southern section of the Delius Kaserne, POTSDAM, about 20 September 1951. Preparations for this movement had been discernible as early as the middle of July 1951. [REDACTED], the units belong to the artillery brigade of the unidentified artillery division in POTSDAM, which was previously stationed in WILDPARK-WEST. The division headquarters was also reported to have moved. [REDACTED] The quarters in WILDPARK-WEST have thus been vacated and are available for reoccupation by other units.

Field Exercises and Training.

4. In general, the divisions which moved to the troop training grounds in April were confirmed there up to the second half of September 1951. Reliable information on the training of these units at some of the troop training grounds indicates that training at regimental level was completed by the end of August or the beginning of September, and was followed by combined-arms exercises above regimental level, involving tanks, infantry, artillery, and special weapons. The divisions thus attained a maximum standard of training at their level by the end of September. The field exercises extended beyond the confines of the troop training grounds since these areas did not provide sufficient space for exercises of such magnitude. No information on training was obtained. Reports on military posts and rail movements indicated that, in many cases, training units left the posts to join the divisions at the troop training grounds, and that rear units which remained in the winter quarters since April were exchanged. No large-scale exercises involving two or more divisions were observed up to about 20 September 1951. No preparatory measures been taken for large-scale fall maneuvers under the command of the army headquarters or the Hq GOPG, such as were observed in the MAGDEBURG-ALTEIN-ABGAL-DESSAU area and east of the Thuringian Woods beginning about 1 October of last year. Components of all armies in the Soviet Zone of Germany, which were concentrated in the ROSSLAU-ITZEMING-BITTAFFELD area in the middle of September 1951, were apparently engaged in a command post exercise rather than a fall maneuver. The river crossing exercises on the Elbe River in the STEBDAL area and south of STEBDAL seemed to have been completed by the end of September.

a. Eighth Guards Army Area.

ONRDRUF and KINDEL:

The components of the XXVIII Gds Itz Rifle Corps and army headquarters units, including the 220th Hvy Tank SP Regt, were confirmed in the ONR-DRUF area until the beginning of September 1951. The information from the KINDEL area was insufficient to establish the identity of the unit there. Large-scale movements of motor columns on the roads in the GOMHA area toward the two troop training grounds about 10 September 1951 were indicative of major field exercises in the area east and north of the Thuringian Woods.

BAD KOESEN:

The engineer camp at BAD KOESEN was occupied by troops in varying numbers, and sometimes by no troops at all, until the middle of August 1951. Engineer vehicles observed there up to that time belong to the army, the XXVIII Gds Itz Rifle Corps, and the 57th Gds Itz Rifle Div. The only unit observed in the engineer camp in mid-September was the engineer battalion of the 57th Gds Itz Rifle Div.

b. Third Shock Army Area.

LETZLING HEATH:

Units which were at LETZLING HEATH and its immediate vicinity from April to the second half of September 1951 belong to the 7th and 10th Gds Tank Div, the 19th Gds Mecz Div, the 207th Itz Rifle Div, army headquarters units, and headquarters units of the LXXIX Itz Rifle Corps. Components of other divisions were still rotated to LETZLING HEATH for short cycles of special training in August and September 1951. Reports received indicated that components of all army headquarters units, combat divisions, and AAA divisions of the armies have been observed at LETZLING HEATH since the beginning of the summer training period, with the exception of headquarters units of the First Gds Mecz Army, the 4th Gds AAA Div, and the 12th Gds Tank Div. The only components of divisions directly subordinate to the GOFJ, which went to LETZLING HEATH during the summer, belonged to the 6th Arty Div. The exact picture of the training activity of the troops there could not be obtained. Intensive training of components of the 207th Itz Rifle Div in the northern portion of the training area decreased at the end of August 1951, and elements of the division left their STENDAL post for an undetermined destination via MAGDEBURG between 4 and 17 September and did not return to the post by 24 September 1951.

BITTKAU:

The training activity of engineer units in the engineer camp at BITTKAU continued up to about 20 September. Vehicles observed there belonged to the headquarters engineer troops of the Third Shock Army, headquarters units of the IX Itz Rifle Corps, components of the army's two mechanized divisions, the 7th Gds Tank Div, the 1st Mecz Div, and the engineer regiment of the GOFG from BERNBURG.

The majority of the components of the 94th Gds Itz Rifle Div and the IX Itz Rifle Corps from SCHLERN left the post for field exercises in the area south of the city in mid-September 1951. Divisional components from HAGENOW and WISNAR were apparently also engaged in these exercises.

c. First Guards Mechanized Army Area.

The majority of the army's divisions were confirmed at the KOENIGSBRUECK troop training grounds until the end of August 1951. In addition, com-

ponents of the 6th (?) Gds AAA Div of the GDFG were rotated from the CHELITZ-AUF area to the troop training grounds until the end of September 1951. Rail movements observed between the military posts of the army's three combat divisions and troop training grounds in August and the first half of September indicated an exchange of elements of these divisions.

d. Second Guards Mechanized Army Area.

The 18th Mecz Div was confirmed at the WITSTOCK troop training grounds up to 20 September 1951. The division continued training above regimental level in the vicinity of the training area in September. It is believed that some components of the 12th Gds Tank Div, and possibly of the 6th Gds Mecz Div, participated in these field exercises. The vehicles observed in the training area during the first half of September included individual vehicles of the IX Mtz Rifle Corps, the 19th Gds Mecz Div, and the engineer regiment of the GDFG from BERENBURG. The 1st Mecz Div did not leave the post for large-scale field exercises by about 20 September. Elements of the division, however, participated in field exercises near RATHENOW and in the area of the 9th and the 12th Gds Tank Divs in September, while other elements continued their special training at the troops training grounds of ALTENGRADOW and JUTTERBOG. Most of the components of the 9th Gds Tank Div left their posts for training areas in early September 1951, possibly practicing in the area between NEUSTADT, NEUBRANDENBURG, and PASEWALK, beyond 15 September 1951. During this period, some of the quarters of the divisions were occupied by units other than those stationed there. Between 6 and 13 September 1951, the 12th Gds Tank Div also left its NEURUPPIN post for field exercises in the woods north of the city, possibly extending the exercises as far as the WITSTOCK troop training grounds.

the headquarters engineer unit of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army participated in the exercises. Some components of the division left NEURUPPIN by rail toward NEUSTADT on the Dosse River between 16 and 19 September 1951. The rotation program of units from the posts of the Second Gds Mecz Army to the JUTTERBOG-LUCKENWALDE training area, which has been observed since the end of June, was continued by the 9th Gds Tank Div until 9 September, by the 12th Gds Tank Div until 21 September, and by army headquarters units until 30 September.

e. Third Guards Mechanized Army Area.

WERDER-MARKENDORF and JUTTERBOG:

The majority of the components of the 6th Gds Tank Div were confirmed at the WERDER-MARKENDORF troop training grounds up to the middle of September 1951. No large-scale field exercises were observed up to that time. Allegedly, the troops would vacate Camp WERDER on 20 October. The components of the 11th Gds Mecz Div continued field training in the JUTTERBOG area. Vehicles of the divisions and headquarters units of the Second Gds Mecz Army were seen in the JUTTERBOG area in September 1951. In addition, components of the Third and Fourth Gds Mecz Armies and an element of the 32d (?) AAA Div of the GDFG from KUPSTRIN must also have been in this area because some of these units were seen arriving there by rail on 1 September and leaving by rail between 27 and 29 September 1951.

WEISSWASSER:

The 9th Mecz Div in Camp NOGHTEN practiced at the troop training grounds and its vicinity until the middle of September 1951 with some field exercises above regimental level extending as far as the NOGHTENBERG area. Some vehicles observed at the camp and during the field exercises were again observed [redacted] may belong to the Northern Group of Forces.

f. Fourth Guards Mechanized Army Area.

TEMPLIN:

The components of the 25th Tank Div, the 6th Gds Mecz Div, and army headquarters units in Camps VOGELSANG and HALLELSRING started field exercises above regimental level in September 1951 possibly with some components of the two divisions practicing jointly. The exercises were held primarily in the areas west and south of the troop training grounds. Components of the 6th Arty Div, which possibly arrived from ALTENGRABOW about 10 September, participated in the exercises for the first time in the middle of September 1951. In addition, some small elements of the Second Gds Mecz Army have been practicing there for some months. A special subject of training for the tank units of the divisions was the fording of the Havel River at several places in late August.

LIEBROSE:

The majority of the components of the 7th Gds Mecz Div and some army headquarters units were confirmed in the training area until the end of September 1951. [] the divisional components from FRANKFURT/ODER would return to the post in October without participating in the fall maneuvers. []

Special Exercises.

5. Most of the components of the 6th Arty Div from the RATHENOW-BRANDENBURG area were confirmed at the ALTENGRABOW troop training grounds until the middle of September. The 30th Gds Gun Arty Brig of the unidentified artillery division in POTSDAM moved to ALTENGRABOW as late as 10 September, while the other brigade of the division, including elements of the division headquarters, returned to POTSDAM on 20 September having participated at the troop training grounds since April. Periodic reports from the troop training grounds and reports on troop movements indicate that, in addition to the brigades of the IV Arty Corps and army and corps headquarters artillery units, the majority of the artillery components of the combat divisions and the majority of the nine AAA divisions alternately went to ALTENGRABOW for firing practice during the summer training period. Since the number of units departing from ALTENGRABOW in late August and in the first half of September surpassed the number of units arriving there, it is believed that the troop training grounds was being gradually vacated during the period covered by the report. Units which were not at ALTENGRABOW during the period from April to September 1951 are:

6. Reports from the MUSTROW AAA range indicate that the AA firing exercises there would be completed at the end of September 1951. The reports were substantiated by the fact that components of all divisions returned to their home stations from the AAA range in September 1951.

7. River crossing exercises on the Elbe River north and south of STENDAL, which were observed as early as June and July 1951, ended in August 1951. A tank unit of the 1st Mecz Div still practiced on the Havel River in the area of ALBERTSHAIN near RATHENOW between 10 and 15 September with headquarters engineer troops of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army.
8. Training courses for engineer components of the Eighth Gds Mecz Army, and possibly for components of the two engineer regiments of the GDFG, continued in the ROSSLAU-AKEN area until the end of September 1951. The troops were quartered in three camps located between BRAMBACH and RIETZ-MECK north of the Elbe River, north of GROSS KUMINAU south of the Elbe River, and east of ROSSLAU.
9. Troops which arrived in the DESSAU-ORANIENBAUM area by train in the middle of September 1951 included: headquarters elements and units of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army from EBETS-WALDE; units, apparently of the 6th Gds Mecz Div and/or the 25th Tank Div, from the TRIPPLIN troop training grounds; units of the 7th Gds Mecz Div from the LIEBEROSE troop training grounds; headquarters engineer troops of the Second Gds Mecz Army; headquarters units of the Third Shock Army and components of the 19th Gds Mecz Div. In addition, motor columns of all divisions and headquarters units of the Third Gds Mecz Army were simultaneously seen north of the Elbe River in this area, and individual vehicles of the 9th Mecz Div south of the Elbe River in the GRAEFENHAINICHEN area.

Information received from the two areas on both sides of the Elbe River up to the end of September provides no definite conclusions as to the purpose of the concentration of components of all six armies there. Since signal vehicles of the GDFG were loaded in DRESDEN near POISSAN for shipment to HALLE on 17 September, it is tentatively believed that a large-scale command post exercise under the Hq GDFG began in the ROSSLAU-WITTENBERG-DELITZSCH area about 20 September 1951 and may possibly go over into a large-scale fall maneuver involving combat units of several armies during the first weeks of October.

Personnel.

10. No incoming or outgoing shipments of **train loads of personnel** were observed. three trains with troops **had** proceeded eastward via FRANKFURT/Oder on 3 September 1951, and a fourth train with troops **had** moved in the same direction 29 September 1951. Two trains with troops allegedly arrived in the Soviet Zone of Germany via FORST on 12 and 30 August 1951.
11. The daily volume of leave traffic up to 20 September 1951 was practically the same as that **for August 1951.**
12. Soviet female auxiliary personnel began arriving in the Soviet Zone of Germany via FRANKFURT/Oder aboard leave trains and special trains in the middle of August 1951. They proceeded to Soviet military posts in the Soviet Zone of Germany and allegedly were to replace German personnel employed in barracks installations and hospitals. This operation is under way at present and its extent cannot be determined. The total number of **Russian** women who arrived via FRANKFURT/Oder prior to 15 September 1951 is estimated at 5,000.

Transportation.

13. The coal stocks of the Soviet Zone Railroads on 17 September 1951 amounted to about 300,000 tons, the equivalent of about 16 days' operations. The stocks thus have declined somewhat since the second half of August 1951.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.General.

14. There were no discernible changes in the strength and organization of the Soviet Army units in the Soviet Zone of Austria and in Hungary up to the middle of September 1951.

15. Movements.

16. The location of the Hq 13th Gds Mecz Div has not been determined since the time the division headquarters departed from VIENNA. Although 50X1-HUM vehicle of the division are still reported from the Hyrtl Orphanage in ROEDLING, there have been no indications that the division headquarters would have moved into the installation. It is also possible that the headquarters was at a troop training grounds in September 1951, and that its new location can be determined only upon completion of the summer training period.
17. The three installations in EISENSTADT, which were occupied by air force units until June 1951, were completely evacuated by them in September 1951. On the other hand, installations in WIENER NEUSTADT and BAD FISCHAU, which quartered components of the 95th Gds Mtz Rifle Div until the summer of 1951, were occupied by air force units in September 1951.

Training.

18. Reports from the Soviet Zone of Austria permit no definite conclusion as to the nature of the training activity of the two combat divisions carried there. It is believed that, as in previous months, only components of the two divisions left their posts for field training. For example, units at troop training grounds at the end of September 1951 are believed to have included components of the 13th Gds Mecz Div from the X City District of VIENNA, KAGRAN, and KLOSTERNEUBURG, and components of the 95th Gds Mtz Rifle Div from Camp SPRATZERN near ST. POELTEN. The majority of the elements of the 23d AAA Div were probably at their posts of KORNEUBURG and STOCKERAU in September 1951.
19. With the exception of an AAA unit from Hungary which arrived for a one-day firing exercise in early September 1951, the Apetlon AAA range was occupied by only a guard detail during the period covered by the report.
20. The components of the 17th Gds Mecz Div from SZOMBATHELY, Hungary, were probably at the HAYASKER troop training grounds in the middle of August 1951. Hungarian civilians stated that the troop training grounds were occupied to capacity with Russian troops at that time.

ROMANIA.

21. the Soviet units there were slightly reinforced in July 1951. The reinforcements may have been only recruits arriving from the U.S.S.R.

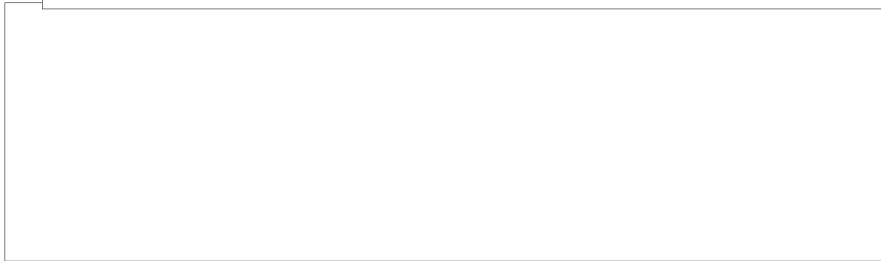

POLAND

22. The 410th Mort Regt of the 20th Tank Div was fairly definitely confirmed in BRLEW until November 1950. The 1711th AAA Regt of this division may have also been stationed there.
