1. Between 9 a.m. and noon on 18 September 1951, there was flying at Stendal-Borstel airfield. Twelve single-engine low-wing monoplanes with in-line engines were at the take-off point. The planes took off in groups of two. They made flights which lasted about 30 minutes and practiced firing at sleeve targets.
2. Between 8:35 and 11:30 a.m. on 21 September, there was the same flying activity as on 18 September. Ten single-engine low-wing monoplanes were observed at the take-off point. No flying was observed on 22 September. [REDACTED]
