1. In October 1950, the headquarters of the 1 and 2 Proletarian Brigades were transferred from Prokuplje to Nis. In March 1951, the headquarters of the 1 Proletarian Brigade was at Titovo Naselje on the Misava River, where the men of the brigade were quartered. The headquarters and men of an unspecified antiaircraft regiment assigned to the 3 Military District were also in barracks at Titovo Naselje. In March 1951, the headquarters and men of the 2 Proletarian Brigade were situated near the railroad station in Nis.
2. An unspecified communications regiment assigned to the 3 Military District had its headquarters and barracks at Dubanj near the railroad station in Nis.
3. During March 1951, two unspecified engineer battalions had begun work on the construction of underground ammunition dumps near the village of Zica, approximately six kilometers east of Nis.
4. The underground ammunition dumps of the 39 Air Force Division in Nis were located on a hill called Markovo Kolo. An unidentified infantry company manned the guard posts which were situated around the ammunition dumps.
5. All of the buildings of the pre-World War II airplane factory in Rankovicevo and all of the buildings on the airfield at Rankovicevo, which were destroyed during World War II, have never been reconstructed. However, the airfield at Rankovicevo was repaired and was put to use as a secondary military airfield. Allegedly there were no buildings or other installations on this airfield.
6. The Superior Military Court of the 3 Military District was located in Krajujevac. In October 1949, a certain Zivanovic and a certain Second Lieutenant Jovanovic were the prosecutors.
7. The Nis Military Prison was located on Crveni Krst, opposite a power plant. The prison provided temporary quarters for individuals who were sentenced to serve long terms until they could be transported to the island of Krk, where they were assigned to forced labor in the marble mines.
8. In 1950 there were approximately 80 officers and 30 soldiers confined at the Nis Military Prison. Among the soldiers in custody were Ljubco Milenkovski, former student, and Slobodan Spirovski, a former mechanic from Velas. Both

25X1 of these soldiers had been sentenced to terms of six years of imprisonment on the charge of promoting pro-IMRO activities in the Army. The majority of officers detained at the Nis Military Prison were high ranking officers who had been given long prison terms either for promoting alleged pro-Cominform activities or for sabotage.
