1. The radio station at Turi (58-50N, 25-24E) was destroyed during the war.* A new station has now been built, and is located between Vasalemma (59-15N, 24-14E) and Laitse (59-13N, 24-24E). The antenna mast appears to be as tall as the old one at Turi. Broadcasts are relayed from Tallinn to Laitse by underground cable.

Foreign Broadcast Reception in Estonia

2. Listening to foreign broadcasts is believed to be widespread, particularly from stations which enable the listener to obtain a general view of world events and politics, which is not provided by the Soviet press. b6

3. [redacted] broadcasts in Russian and Estonian from other foreign stations are constantly jammed, rendering listening practically impossible. Even the use of frame aerials, which is being adopted by listeners, yields little improvement.
4. Listening to foreign stations is not officially prohibited; but, since it is better to be safe, listeners usually make arrangements so that the neighbors do not hear, in case the neighbors are not sufficiently reliable. Similar precautions are, of course, also taken in the presence of strangers.
