1. On 27 September 1951, source observed a convoy of 14 trucks carrying about 300 troops with field equipment and towing eight model 1938 122-mm artillery pieces leaving the Hindenburg Kaserne in [REDACTED]. Nine of the trucks were

on Am Arnimer Damm about 7 p.m.. (1) Eight SU-100 SP guns left the Albrecht der Baer Kaserne about the same time, driving toward the training area on Am Arnimer Damm. (2) A briefing held in the officers quarters on Liebknechtstrasse at 4 p.m. on 29 September was attended by about 80 officers. Two generals arrived in sedan

2. Soviet troops were seen engaged in exercises in the area of Uenglingen, Schernikau and Steinfeld on 2 October. Telephone sections strung lines from the Hindenburg Kaserne toward Schernikau via Uenglingen. [REDACTED]

Sixteen groups of 40 to 45 soldiers each marched into the Taentzien Kaserne at about 6 p.m. on 6 October, coming from Uenglinger Strasse. The unit was headed by five field-grade officers, a military band and a furled flag. The soldiers of 15 groups wore crimson epaulets, including some with artillery and signal insignia, and the soldiers of the last group red-bordered black epaulets with

(1) [REDACTED] the artillery pieces belong to the 207th Mtz Rifle Div and, thus, to the 693d How Arty Regt which is carried in Stendal. Information obtained in the course of 1951 tends to indicate that units of the regiment are stationed in the Albrecht der Baer Kaserne and at Borstel airfield.

(2) The information confirms the quartering in the Albrecht der Baer Kaserne of elements of the 16th (?) Tank Regt of the 207th Mtz Rifle Div. See [REDACTED]

(3) The house referred to as officers' quarters was previously reported as an officers' club. The general with two stars is a lieutenant general.

[REDACTED] briefing belong to headquarters units of the Third Shock Army and the LXXIX Mtz Rifle Corps, and to the 207th Mtz Rifle Div and the Hq GORP.

(4) [REDACTED] the exercises west of Stendal were conducted by units quartered in Stendal. The convoy observed on 30 September 1951 probably was returning from these exercises.

(5) According to several reports indicating that infantry troops are quartered in the Tauntzien Kaserne, it is believed that a motorized rifle regiment of the 207th Mtz Rifle Div is quartered there. [REDACTED] 25X1A
