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- the Shihchiao Customs 2, the following materials were imported into Communist China through that station during the month of September 1951: 1,132 tons of unsmoked rubber, 3,321 rubber tires, 4,486 cases of spare parts for automobiles, 5,868 boxes of medicine, 4 complete aircraft engines, 109 boxes of aircraft spare parts, 92 radio sets, 223 bicycles, 579 rubber bicycle tires, 142,000 pairs of rub er shoes, bales of cotton from the United States, 862 boxes of chemical ruel (sic), 4,127 tons of metal, 45,370 drums of gasoline, 11,324 drums of lubricating oil, c,324 drums of Diesel oil, 24 motors, 224 generators, 94 reals of electric wire, 1,304 boxes of rivets, and 44 reels of cop er wire.
- In early October 1951 the Chin Ch'eng (在 城) Company, a Chinese Communist organization which had formerly engaged in transporting goods through Shench uan (114-08, 22-32) but had moved to macao on instructions from the Central and South China Bureau, was occupying room 213 in the Jen Jen (1= / notel, macao. YALG Ching-ming (本) and TENG Asien (存), agents of the Central and South China Eureau, were on the staff of the company. PAO riao (色本葉), connected with the China Travel Service, near sharf 26, was in close relations with the Chin Ch'eng Company. PAU is responsible for smug ling Chinese from Macao to Hong Kong.
- 3. On 8 October the Nan Awang Tracing Company hired the junks TA YU LI, T'AI FSING and HSING CHI to transport 1,500 drums of gasoline from wharf 5 to Whampos. On the same day the wan Kuang Company sent three truckloads of copper bars from Marehouse #3, Praga Ponte e Horta, to Marf 32, where the bars were loaded on a ship.
- On 15 October four sailing junks arrived in macao with a total of 200 tons of copper bars and wire. The copper was valued at HK \$10,000 per ton, and

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was sent to the Man Amang Tracing Company, in care of the Ta T'un (大原) Company, third floor, 9 Rua Almirante Sergio, macao.

- 5. On 15 october the no Lung (Company, 229 ming Low Street west, Long Aong, shipped the following materials to the Man Auang Trading Company, on the TA LAI and the TE hSING: 1,000 200-pound boxes of electric melaing bars, and 600 260-pound boxes of electric welding bars.
- 6. On 17 october three sailing junks and a motor junk arrived at magao from liong nong with the following cargoes: 150 18-foot and 150 28-foot lengths of water pipe, weigning 14 pounds por foot and priced at in \$31 per foot; 25 tons of copier plate, costing in \$4,400 per ton. These goods had be a sent to the Man nuang Company by the Yu Sheng (於) Company. The Man nuang Company also received from LIM Chan-ch'u (於) of the Lien Sheng (其) Company 45 tons of iron plate, costing ha \$1,500 per ton, and 250 boxes of shovel blades, costing ha \$2,400 per box.
- 7. On 18 October two motor junks and a sailing junk brought the following goods from hong Kong to macae: 50 tons of steel bars, costing hk \$1,000 per ton; 15 tons of black iron sheets (12' x 14'), costing HK \$2,500 per ton; 45 boxes of American-made carbon black, each box weighing 200 prunds; 21 tons of 3-inch water pipe, total value FK \$67,000. These goods were delivered to the ann Amang Company's T'sip'ing Marchouse. In addition, the Ta Chung (A the) Company of hong kong sent a shipment of 10 tons of water pipe: 5,000 feet of 4-inch pipe, costing HA \$10 per foot; 5,000 feet of 3-inch pipe, costing HA \$7.50 per foot; 2,000 feet of 2-inch pipe, costing HA \$7.50 per foot; 2,000 feet of 2-inch pipe, costing HA \$2.40 per foot, and 5,000 feet of 1-inch pipe. The Amangai Trading Company, 142 Connaught hoad, nong hong, also sent 70 tons of galvanized iron sheets, costing HA \$950 per ton, and 24 tons of black sheet iron, costing HA \$2.000 per ton. This cargo was for the Ch'ang Sheng (12 M) Trading Company, 70 Chiang Lan Road, Canton.
- 8. On 18 October 1951 the wan Kuang Company produced through Blackie JUNG (197) six transits for use at airfields. Each transit cost nK .0,500 and weighed 20 pounds.
- 9. In early Ustober the Ta Cheng Company produced 100 cases of films and photographic equipment, to a total value of MK \$2,000,000, from Blackie JUNG. The goods were shipped to the Man Adang Company in Macao, and the first installment of the payment was deposited in the nong Aong and Shanghai Bank and the Ssu hai (MT) Bank.
- 10. On 11 October a Soviet vessel, SS 心-CHI-LO (表文人), about 3,000 tons, arrived at whampon from Isin too with a quantity of heavy armament and munitions. After unloading the careo at shampon the vessel left with about 100 technicians and a company of troops aboard. 2

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
